Course Description

This course examines the evolution of money, banking systems and financial intermediation in the context of global and domestic developments. It provides students with an understanding of the theoretical foundations, institutional structures, technological innovations, policy frameworks and regulatory changes shaping modern banking and monetary systems. Emphasis is placed on both developed and emerging markets, with particular focus on trends impacting Uganda and the broader African region.

Course objectives

By the end of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. Analyze the historical and contemporary developments in money and banking
- 2. Evaluate the roles of central banks, commercial banks and non-bank financial institutions in economic growth
- 3. Assess the impact of monetary policy, regulation and innovation on the banking industry.
- 4. Critically appraise emerging issues in financial technology, digital currencies and global banking integration
- 5. Apply advanced theoretical and empirical tools to analyze banking sector developments
